Effective Wednesday December 13<sup>th</sup>, 2017, the Windsor Police Service will be providing 911 call-answering and Police Dispatch Services for the Amherstburg Police Service. It is important to note the following procedural changes when contacting our dispatch centre for alarms.

The Windsor Police Service utilizes the **Avaya** Contact Centre and Forced Call Answer System which will automatically respect the call priority, place calls on hold as required and play a recorded announcement when all call-takers are busy on active calls. The calls will then be dropped into the call-taker's headset in priority sequence.

With Forced Call Answer, calls will be answered in the following priority sequence:
911 calls – Priority One (1)
Ambulance, Fire and Alarm calls – Priority Two (2)
(519) 258-6111 Non-Emergency calls – Priority Three (3)

This poses a problem for out of town Monitoring Stations that are unable to call **911** for "Hold-up, Medical and Panic Alarms" in addition to all Pharmacies and Financial Institutions. Effective Wednesday December 13<sup>th</sup>, 2017, all out of town Alarm Companies requesting dispatch for Amherstburg Police Service (in Priority Two (2) sequence) are required to call (519) 258-1713 for the above noted alarm calls only. All other alarm calls will be called in utilizing the non-emergency number (519) 258-6111.

Local Alarm Companies can continue to call **911 only for "Hold-up, Medical & Panic Alarms" along with Pharmacies and Financial Institution alarms**. All other alarm calls will be called in utilizing the non-emergency number **(519) 258-6111**.

For both out of town and local alarm companies - the monitoring station <u>must immediately</u> <u>identify the Police Agency as either "Amherstburg" or "Windsor</u>". All Amherstburg Police Service dispatches will **NOT BE CANCELLED** under any circumstances.

Please ensure that all staff is made aware of these important changes to ensure a smooth transition and to alleviate any unnecessary delays in service.
