Current and emerging surveillance technology is subject to layers of regulation and compliance across industries. Leading privacy lawyer David Fraser will lead a discussion of the Canadian laws applicable to video and audio surveillance in different contexts, and look over the horizon at emerging technologies such as facial recognition, remote sensing and gait analysis.

In his talk, David will discuss:

- The laws applicable across the board to all collection of personally identifiable information, whether video, audio or otherwise
- The different rules that apply to overt and covert deployment of devices
- The different rules that apply to public and private spaces
- The different rules that apply to employee information and third party information
- The specific criminal law rules that apply to audio surveillance and collecting video in sensitive locations, and consequences for their violation
- Current thinking and best practices related to biometrics, such as face detection, facial recognition and other personal characteristics
